You said...So we did:

My child has SEND and the school gives them the support they need to succeed: Our new Inclusion Lead Mrs Samuel has been working with parents, teachers and children with SEND to ensure the provision meets the needs of the children so that they make good progress and get the most out of their educational experience. The school makes sure it's pupils are well behaved: 'The Farnborough Grange Way' is being shared with all children on a daily basis. This is the language that we use to share our high expectations of behaviour. We also have class promises in every class that the children made together at the beginning of the school year, in addition to the three school values.

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year: To support with this, we now have half-termly 'Meet the Teacher' events, which begin with a short workshop in the hall with strategies for how to help your child at home, and then separates into year groups, where parents can meet their children's teachers, and hear about their children's learning enquiry for each half term. We also share overviews of the subject-specific learning both in-person at the Meet The Teacher events and on the class pages on our website, for those of you who are unable to attend in person. You can see workshop materials on our Learning Together page on our school website.

The school lets me know how my child is doing: A general update of the children's learning is posted weekly on the class pages on our school website. You (parents / carers) are invited to 2 formal parents consultation meetings each year where you can discuss your child specifically with your child's class teacher. You also received a written report in the Summer term, which goes into great detail about your child's year. This is replaced with a 3rd parent's consultation meeting if your child is in Nursery. In addition to this, there are informal opportunities to discuss how your child is doing with the class teachers at drop-off and pick-up, or a meeting at a different time if you contact the office. We also have a home-school-link-worker, Mrs O'Regan, who is able to support with home-school communications.

There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school: We cover the full requirements of the National Curriculum, as can be seen on our skills progression documents found separated into each subject on our <u>curriculum page</u> of the school website. The areas of learning for each learning enquiry are also shared on a one-page overview that is shared at Meet The Teacher and on the <u>class pages</u> on our school website.

My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school: All teachers run clubs at school, and we also have additional clubs that are provided by external companies such as sporting clubs and Fun, Fit & Yoga. These are all available at no cost to families, as they are supported through our Sports Premium fund. Clubs timetables are sent out at the beginning of each term to all classes, excluding Nursery. Year R are not able to join clubs until the Spring term as we feel they need the first term to settle into new school routines without adding any more to their timetables!
