TOP_{is}...

a supportive package delivered by qualified, experienced and friendly staff who work in local TOP teams (see over for county lists).

Each team is supported through regular supervision, training and county-wide liaison to ensure high quality service delivery. The teams use a variety of techniques and interventions which are researched and specifically aim to support children with social communication difficulties or on the autistic spectrum.

How is TOP delivered?

TOP can be offered to help the child learn in all settings: in the home, pre-school and then transition to school (first term, Year R only). The exact pattern of the programme will depend on the child's individual needs; this may include:

- visits to the child's home to work with the child and their parents
- visits to the pre-school to help the preschool meet the child's needs
- visits to school to work with school staff to prepare and support the child's transition
- a flexible time allocation of between 5 15 hours per week per family (this includes an element of travel time, preparation and record keeping).

TOP

For whom is TOP suitable?

Children who would benefit from TOP would be:

- pre-school age
- attending (or planning to attend) a local pre-school and likely to transfer to their local mainstream school (TOP is not available to children attending a specialist pre-school setting)
- experiencing difficulties with social communication

Children do not need:

- a formal diagnosis
- an Education, Health and Care Plan

What teaching interventions are used on TOP?

All teaching interventions used are tailored to match the individual needs of each child.

Common approaches include:

- visual structure in the child's environment e.g. 'TEACCH' approach
- visual support to develop the child's spontaneous communication e.g. PECS
- developing play through child centred methods e.g. 'special time' or directive methods e.g. 'play scripts'; 'identi-play'
- teaching new skills through structured learning and behavioural approaches
- working on social interactional skills

- developing self-help independence and life skills
- developing self-control through the use of behaviour plans.

In consultation with everyone involved with the child targets are drawn up in an agreed plan/Individual Education Plan (IEP) between home, pre-school/school and TOP staff.

Teaching strategies are carefully negotiated with parents and pre-school so that they can be used to effectively support the child throughout the day in pre-school and at home.

All teaching strategies are modelled by TOP staff. The key person in the preschool/school and parent(s) follow these strategies when with the TOP worker and try them out alone with the child, in between TOP sessions. This way the child gains consistency of support in all settings with all the people in their lives.
