English

As writers...

We will start our term by looking at the book *Dear Zoo*. We will learn what an adjective is and will then apply our learning to plan and create our own lift the flap books.

Towards the end of the half term, we will explore poetry, using *Oi Frog!* as inspiration.

English

As readers...

We will take part in daily phonics lessons, following the Read Write Inc. programme.

Mathematics

As mathematicians...

We will start the term by learning about place value. We will be focussing on the numbers between 0 and 10.

We will then move on to look at adding and subtracting within 10.

Science

As scientists...

We will be exploring animals. We will learn the different animal groups and how we can classify animals. We will also learn about what different animals eat and how they can be carnivores, herbivores or omnivores.

As musicians...
